# Happy December Everyone,

How is it possible this is the last month of the year? Seems like we were just celebrating a Super Bowl victory. Now we are hopefully marching towards another one. I thought 2022 was the year for changes at Beth Torah but 2023 took us to a new level.

In March of 2023, Rabbi Cattapan and the Board of Trustees announced we would each go our separate ways when Rabbi's contract ends June 30, 2024. In July of this past year, Jes Lindsay left to start her own business. These are two very large vacancies to fill! We got busy setting up our committees for each position. Job descriptions and marketing packets needed to be completed and submitted. Our Rabbi application was posted after Yom Kippur and the Executive Director position was posted in October.

Progress has been made. We have finished two rounds of interviews in our Rabbi search process with candidate site visits being scheduled over the next several weeks. Additionally, we have an Executive Director candidate who has completed two interviews and is in town for a site visit the weekend of December 1. Multiple announcements have gone out listing the events for the weekend.


This year we welcomed Morgan Fasbinder as Director of Youth and Young Adult Education. In a few short months she has taken a struggling Weiner Religious School and has remarkedly increased enrollment by over 30%. She has also renewed multiple alliances and partnerships that we lost over the last few years.

Beth Torah members Ron Fredman and Jill Maidhof are using their professional talents to chair two important committees. Ron Fredman graciously stepped up to chair our fundraising committee. This year's High Holy Days fundraiser was our most successful yet and we have more campaigns on the drawing board to be announced soon. Jill Maidhof continues to introduce thought-provoking and meaningful adult education programming that already stretches into next year.

Our social justice / social action programming is on the rise with the announcement of a partnership between Tikkun-KC (Affordable Housing) and Footprints (Homeless Veterans) that will provide ongoing hands on, start-to-finish programming for CBT with job site work parties, food and clothing drives and so much more. We will also coordinate this program with other area synagogues that could lead to other opportunities for Beth Torah. Another major announcement on a new opportunity will be out shortly.

The Beth Torah Bakers are back making sweet treats for future onegs. I stopped by the kitchen the last time they were at CBT and can personally vouch for everything they are making.

Lezlie Zucker has developed an excellent lay leader ensemble to include Dr Jim Kaplan, Denton Williams and Joel Krichiver. All three volunteers are talented individuals and do an excellent job

We are close to announcing a new chair for our Beth Torah Women's Group. Group meetings, luncheons and speakers along with congregation activities are on the drawing board for this group.

Nina Shik has taken over our small group program and done an amazing job. We have more groups than last year, excellent programming and a very high participation rate.

All of the above are updates to existing programs, leadership changes or enhancements from this time last year. This past year my Tekiah articles have had a common theme of change. It mirrors my personal life as well.



# Hanukkah Candle Lighting Guide

Hanukkah lasts for 8 nights, and on each night, we light one more candle than the night before. Arrange the lights in your hanukkiyah each night starting with the rightmost branches, and the shamash (helper) light in its place.

Place the hanukkiyah where many people can see it, ideally near a window or door.

(On the Shabbat of Chanukah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.)

Light the Shamash - the helper candle - first using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights; say or sing:

who sanctifies us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle

the Hanukkah lights.
