Jewish Learning: Setting Priorities in our Lives

In the Weiner Religious School, we try to inculcate the idea in the next generation that Jewish

learning is something we value at every age. Under the leadership of our new full-time principal, *Menahelet* Morgan Fasbinder, our teaching staff aspires to be an example of Jewish learning and living.

But it is not enough that the WRS is a place of Jewish learning. Each of our members can be an example of what it means to a lifelong Jewish learner. The great Talmudic sage, Hillel, teaches, "Do not say, "When I am free I will study," for perhaps you will never be free." In his translation of *Pirke Avot* (Ethics of the Sages), Rabbi Rami Shapiro adds: "Do not hope to find time to study; time is never found, *only* made." In other words, your Jewish learning is a priority in your life, or it is not. Our *Talmud Torah* committee and I have been planning innovative and interesting approaches to Jewish learning (See page 3 for adult ed offerings) What is missing in our adult education offerings is YOU. I am asking you to take a look at your busy schedule and take steps to incorporate Jewish learning into the life of your family. If you make it a priority, we are here to help, inspire, and challenge you with our many Adult Education offerings.

I believe that even we, rabbis and teachers, must continue to learn. Earlier this year, I spent part of my Sabbatical learning new things. I invite you to join me on another evening of learning about Judaism in Germany, its history and its future. On Friday, July 21st, we will hold a *Beit Midrash* on the topic of memorials in Berlin. I will share pictures and observations about the many ways in which the atrocities of Nazism are remembered in the German capital (the Holocaust will be discussed, parental discretion advised).

The bottom line is that I want you to be present at as many of our learning opportunities as possible. We offer a variety of topics at different times and locations during the week. We hope that we have something for everyone, but if we are missing something, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or our *Talmud Torah* committee. We are here to listen. Please, join us.


